# From the Pastor's Study

#### Yes, Lord!

"15 So it was, when the angels had gone away from them into heaven, that the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." <sup>16</sup> And they came with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger" (Luke 2:15-16).

At the heart of Christianity is obedience. Obedience is the litmus test that authenticates our faith (Luke 4:46, John 15:10). This means that at some point, God may ask you to do something that doesn't make sense. In those moments, you have a choice. Will you submit to His Lordship? Or, will you remain the Lord of our own life? Today, I encourage you, regardless of what you're asked, to trust God by saying, "Yes, Lord!

What better season to learn obedience than Christmas? The events surrounding the birth of Christ highlight the results of obedience (Matthew 1-2, Luke 1-2). An engaged young woman, Mary risked her life by saying, "Yes, Lord!" Joseph, a caring fiancé, encountered gossip and suffered humiliation by saying, "Yes, Lord!"

The shepherds went about their daily routine when angels appeared, informing them that a special baby, Christ the Lord, was born in Bethlehem. How did the shepherds respond to the wonderful news of Christ? They responded with costly obedience, temporarily leaving their sheep grazing in the field to pursue Christ. Shepherds were taught never to leave their sheep unattended. Their act of abandonment wouldn't make sense. However, at the news of someone more valuable than their sheep, the shepherds responded, "Yes, Lord!"

This month, a situation may arise that challenges you to say, "Yes, Lord!" What the Lord asks may not make sense, but it will be worth it! As the shepherds, I encourage you to say, "Yes, Lord!"
